What is Medicaid?

Medicaid is a health insurance program for those whose income is below amounts set by the federal and state government. Eligibility varies by age, income and disability.

The following are the most common Medicaid programs available for elderly and disabled adults:

MAA- Medicaid for Older Citizens age 65 or older.

MAB- Medicaid for the Blind or Visually Impaired.

MAD- Medicaid for Disabled Citizens of any age who are unable to work due to a disability that is expected to last at least 12 months.

Other Coverage options:

CAP/DA-provides an alternative to nursing facility care for disabled persons 18 years of age or older.

CAP/AIDS-provides an alternative to nursing facility care for persons with AIDS as well as children who are HIV positive.

Cost of Care in a Nursing Facility-A nursing facility is a licensed skilled or intermediate care facility. Medicaid contributes to the payment of cost of care (room and board)

Qualified Medicare beneficiaries-Q- limited to payment of Medicare premiums, deductibles and co-insurance

Qualified Medicare Beneficiaries-B-MQB-B people who are enrolled in Medicare Part A and have income between 100% and 120% of poverty are eligible for the buy-in payment of the Medicare Part B premium

Special Assistance- SA- Coverage for Medicaid Certified Rest home/Family Care home

Family Planning Waiver- FPW- For men age 19-60 and women age 19-55 who are ineligible for all other Medicaid programs and are able to have children.

Applying for Medicaid

An application must be completed to receive Medicaid.

You will need to provide items to prove you qualify for Medicaid. If possible, bring in or send with your application. If you **can't** get all of these items, **please apply anyway**. You can provide information after you apply and the **caseworker can help** if you need assistance.

Eligibility Documents Required (not all inclusive)

- Proof of State Residency
- Meet citizenship/Alienage and Identity Requirements
- Social Security Cards and birth certificates
- Proof of Income and expenses
- List of vehicles you or anyone in your household own
- List of all property you own
